Example: Tables and Arrow Sign

Iron River Lions Club Use of Rides

The Iron River Lions Club is not a rental company and therefore should not rent any rides to any organizations. There are rental companies that serve this need in the area. It brings up insurance and liability questions. It has been shown that even taking the inflatable equipment to an event other than the Blueberry Festival is not a profitable option when we consider all the coordination, work and wear and tear far outweigh the profits to the club.

In summary, the Iron River Lions Club does not rent, borrow or loan any of our rides but continues to let civic organizations approved by the board to borrow other equipment.
