WHAT IS LIONISM?

Lionism is based on volunteer service and fellowship. It is an organized effort to help others who are less fortunate on a local, state, national and world wide level.

It involves a commitment to working hard to achieve club goals. As a reward you have that “good feeling” that continues to gather within you as “You Serve” in the spirit of Lionism.

MULTIPLE DISTRICT 27

There are 10 Lions Districts in Wisconsin. The Iron River Lions belong to District 27 C2. The Lions of Wisconsin are comprised of 557 individual clubs with a combined membership of 19,510 Lions. Wisconsin is one multiple district of Lions Clubs International, which has 45,757 clubs in 206 countries or geographical areas. There are 1.35 million Lions worldwide. The state office is located in Stevens Point.

The Lions operate with Wisconsin Lions Foundation which is located in Rosholt on the Wisconsin Lions Camp property. The foundation administers statewide projects for the Lions, highlighted by the camp for blind, deaf, and cognitively disabled children and now, serving diabetic children. Our latest venture is our Lions Pride campaign to ensure our Lions activities well into the future.

The Lions Eye Bank of Wisconsin is an affiliated Lions organization for the Wisconsin Lions of Multiple District 27 and is located in Madison. The Eye Bank is governed by a board of directors that includes representatives from all 10 districts within Multiple District 27.

There are more than 2,800 Wisconsin Lioness members in 104 communities statewide. Lioness members are affiliate members of Lions Clubs. There are also Leo Clubs throughout the state. Leo membership is open to all young men and women between the ages of 14 and 20. The club is sponsored by a Lions Club which serves as their mentor.

Each District has a “Governor” and a slate of officers. Two Iron River Lions served as District Governor, Jim Bellefeuille (1988-89) and Wayne Smith (1996-97).

The dues paid by each member are divided up between Lions Club International (getting the largest share), and their District and local club activities. These dues are collected on an annual basis, by December 31st.

Every year there are District, State and International Conventions. Each club is allowed voting delegates depending on the membership. Iron River has 7 votes.

WHO ARE THE LIONS?

The Lions are men and women dedicated to serving those in need, whether in their own community or half-way around the world. In addition to humanitarian service, they enjoy fellowship and develop leadership skills.

ORIGIN

Lions began in the United States in 1917 when a group of independent clubs responded to an idea presented to them by a young Chicago insurance agent, Melvin Jones. He believed that local business clubs should expand their horizons from purely professional concerns to the betterment of their communities and the world at large.

The association became “international” with the formation of the Windsor, Ontario, Canada, Lions Club in 1920. From that time on clubs were formed worldwide.

NAME

The official name of “Lions” in “The International Association of Lions Clubs” or simply “Lions Clubs International.”

EMBLEM DESCRIPTION

It consists of a gold letter “L” on a circular purple field. Bordering this is a circular gold area with two conventionalized lion profiles at either side facing away from the center. The words “Lions” appear at the top and “International” at the bottom. Symbolically, the lions face both past and future – proud of the past and confident of the future.

THE COLORS

Purple/Blue and Gold

To Lions, purple/blue stands for loyalty to country, friends, one’s self and the integrity of mind and heart. It is the traditional color strength, courage and tireless dedication to a cause. Gold symbolizes sincerity of purpose, liberality in judgement, purity in life and generosity in mind, heart and purse toward those in need.
